Fave Beaton - Fave joined the Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) in 1963 as a Radar Plotter. At the time, women accounted for 1.5% of the population of the RCN. She served ashore in Halifax and Shelburne, NS, the CNE in Ontario. and travelled as a Flight Attendant with the Royal Canadian Air Force. She was released as a Sargent in 1973 due to pregnancy. Faye has lived in the neighbourhood for 4 years. She loves the peacefulness of our natural trails and the friendliness of the people she meets while walking.

Andy Parker - Andy joined the Canadian Armed Forces in 1978 as a Boatswain. He was born and raised in New Brunswick, however, elected to serve onboard West Coast ships. # HRM LAKEWATCHERS PROGRAM **UPDATE & CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS**

The HRM LakeWatchers' program started in Spring 2022. The program monitors various HRM Lakes by taking measurements of parameters such as conductivity, pH, dissolved oxygen, temperature. Pictured below and on the right is volunteers recording these measurements. Water samples are also collected and sent to a certified laboratory for chemical analysis.



Some of the data is collected by an Environmental consultant while Morris and Russell Lakes are collected by our dedicated PEHRA volunteers. Once there are a few rounds of data HRM and PEHRA, along with other community groups can study the data and look for trends, and levels of harmful contaminants, and assess the overall "health and safety" of our lakes. PEHRA volunteers will be providing the data and a summary of the results soon, once all the lab results are in for the 2023 sampling events.



### **COMMUNITY TRAILS UPDATE**

The PEHRA Trails and Parks Committee continues its work of monitoring our trails and lobbying for maintenance and improvement. This summer was a busy one with many initiatives where we liaised with HRM Parks and Recreation to address two main concerns:

- 1. Lobbying for the replacement of trailhead signage which had been damaged by hurricanes. We visited five trailhead locations with the new Superintendent of Parks East, Chris Poole. Mr. Poole was very willing to replace signs at all the locations but wished to follow the design standard now being used at other HRM parks. The new signs will include a map of the trails and parklands, and will be installed next summer.
- 2. Trails Maintenance HRM Parks Operations is supposed to trim trail shoulders at least twice each growing season, but our main trail (the Portland Lakes Greenway) seems to be off their radar. After complaints from the community, a first trim was finally made in early August, but there has been no second trim to date. Thank you to our Trail Stewards who maintain our trails in the meantime! The map below shows the nature trails on HRM parkland in Portland Hills. These trails are pleasant but fairly rough, and HRM Parks has largely discontinued maintenance. Our PEHRA trails team, however, monitors the trail, cuts back bush and reports major issues such as blockage by fallen trees. Norman Steele - I have been the Environment Committee Chair for 12 years, and have also been an administrator of the PEHRA Facebook group for several years. I care about our community and its ecological environment, in particular our Dartmouth Lakes. Growing up in Dartmouth and as a former swimmer, lifeguard, and windsurfer I understand the significant recreational and aesthetic value of our lakes. As an Environmental Professional, I am concerned with the continued deterioration of the ecological health of Morris and Russell Lake and want to protect their future. There are so many things to appreciate living in Portland Estates. Our Lakes, Trails, and Parkland are most valuable to me.





### Hugh Millward - PEHRA Chair, Trails Committee Chair

I have been a part of PEHRA for a combined total of 26 years. I was the President/Chairperson from 2007-2013 and 2021-present. I have been the Chair of the Trails and Parks Committee from 2001 to the present, which is a committee I established. I have continued my passion for our community trails through other roles such as the HRM Active Transportation Advisory Committee, Halifax Regional Trails Association and Dartmouth Lakes Advisory Board. A loop trail along Ellenvale and Russell brooks has been named after me, and its maintenance by HRM has continued. I have also been an administrator on the PEHRA Facebook group for more than 15 years.

# Dalyce Mallion - Birches Park Chair and past PEHRA Chair

I joined PEHRA 30 years ago when Phil O'Hara founded our association. I was excited to get involved right away with the gate restoration project (1994) then initiated the Gates & Garden Committee (2001) and the Birches Park Committee (2005) to continue to help identify improvements. I enjoyed collaborating with HRM and our Councillors on the many projects that have impacted the park...relocating the playground (2007), building the Community. Message Centre (2010), landscaping the field (2014), building our wonderful



Gazebo (2018), and supporting our PEC Scouts with the addition of an accessible equipment storage container (2021). As Chair (2016 - 2021) I organized the annual Community Fun Fests to generate community spirit and particularly enjoyed emceeing the picnic races, watching children have so much fun with the old-fashioned sac race. I am proud of our neighbourhood. I appreciate living in a community that is safe, clean, has trails, a wonderful park and good facilities. Volunteering with PEHRA has been a rewarding way of preserving what we have here while working with a team of caring individuals.
